



The latest data for Northwest Indiana (May 2020) shows employment in Northwest Indiana beginning to recover for the effects of shelter in place policies due to CIVID-19. The unemployment rate for the state and region after reaching their highest ever recorded mark in April. The number of unemployed people by more than 15,000 from the previous month while employment rose by 30,000. Despite these improvements, employment is still far from pre-COVID levels.

Total private employment rose by 2% from April, but is down 11% from the previous year. Service providing industries have been hit the hardest hit thus far, down 12% from the previous compared to 6% for goods producing industries.

Looking more closely at the specific industrial workforce changes, nearly every industry, with the exception of Education (-.6%), Manufacturing (-1.6%), and Government (-6.7%) saw employment rise. Those with the largest change from the previous month include Construction (12%), Accommodation and Food Service (9%), and Leisure and Hospitality (8%). This is welcome news for the region as these industries employ a significant portion of the population and were some of the hardest hit.
